

CHEUNG Lung-wah 張龍華

Actor

Cheung Lung-wah's father is Cheung Muk-sang (also known as Cheung Tai-kwan), the fourth elder brother of Cheung Muk-chun. Together, the two brothers led the Xintiancai Chaozhou Opera Troupe. Cheung Lung-wah joined Xintiancai at a young age and later appeared in the troupe's Chaozhou-dialect films as a child character. For example, he played the younger brother of the lead actress Ma Wenluan in The Stepmother (1960); in A Wronged Daughter-in-Law (produced by Tor Ying, 1960), he played An'an, the son of female protagonist Pang San'niang. In addition, he also garnered supporting roles in A Common Scholar (1963), Romance in a Rainstorm (1965) and Two-Year-Old Husband (1965). As Xue Kui in The Sit Family (1962), Cheung had a more significant role, memorable for wielding two melee weapons while bickering with the lead character played by Chan Chor-wai. Cheung was also a disciple of Northern martial arts master Kwan Ching-leung. He kicked-start his career as a martial arts actor in the two-part film The Scholar Cui Mingfeng (1968), in which he played the villain hunting after the main character. After Chaozhou-dialect films entered a lull, he performed Chaozhou opera overseas with Xintiancai, playing wusheng (military male) and acting as its martial arts choreographer. Cheung also directed and starred in the critically-acclaimed short play *Stopping the Horse* in Singapore. He later occasionally appeared as a martial arts stuntman in films.
