

Dolly SOO Fung 蘇鳳 (1939.3.19-2007.9.28)

Actress

A native of Panyu, Guangdong Province, Soo was born in Shanghai with the original name Li Shaojuan and her father ran a pharmacy. She received secondary school education in Shanghai and participated in the school's drama group. At the age of 13, she came to Hong Kong with her family.

In 1956, Soo joined Motion Picture and General Investment Co. Ltd. (MP & GI) and her peers included Kitty Ting Hao, Kelly Lai Chen, Tian Qing, Lin Cang, etc. She debuted on screen with *Green Hills and Jade Valleys* (1956). Never a big star, she stayed with MP & GI throughout her career, primarily as second lead or supporting actress. However, her gentle and quiet demeanour left a great impression on the audience. She acted in over 10 films, including *Our Sister Hedy* (1957), *Wedding Bells for Hedy* (1959), *June Bride* (1960), *The Wild, Wild Rose* (1960) and *Sun, Moon and Star* (1961). She retired from acting after her marriage in 1962.
