



LIU Enjia 劉恩甲 (1916–1968.4.25)

Actor

A native of Yanshan, Hebei, Liu spent his childhood in Jilin, Tianjin and studied at the Ha'erbin School of Commerce. He enrolled in Manchukuo Film Association in 1937 and began his career as an actor. He acted in films including *Honeymoon Express* (1938). He joined Central Motion Picture in Beijing in 1947 but soon left. He came to Hong Kong upon the invitation of director Zhang Junxiang in 1949 to take part in Yung Hwa Motion Picture Industries Ltd's *Hearts Aflame* (1949). Liu had since then stayed in Hong Kong to act in films and later came into people's line of sight with *Gold Diggers* (1952).

He officially joined Motion Picture and General Investment Co Ltd ([MP & GI], later restructured into Cathay Organisation [HK] [1965] Ltd) in 1956. Liu was a talented comic actor and had appeared in *Golden Lotus* (1957), *The Battle of Love* (1957), *Riots in the Outer Space* (1959), *Sun, Moon and Star* (1961), etc. He was best known for his performance in *The Greatest Civil War on Earth* (1961). His last film was *To Kill a Rover* (1968), a Cathay production. Liu died of a heart attack in Hong Kong on 25 April 1968.
